

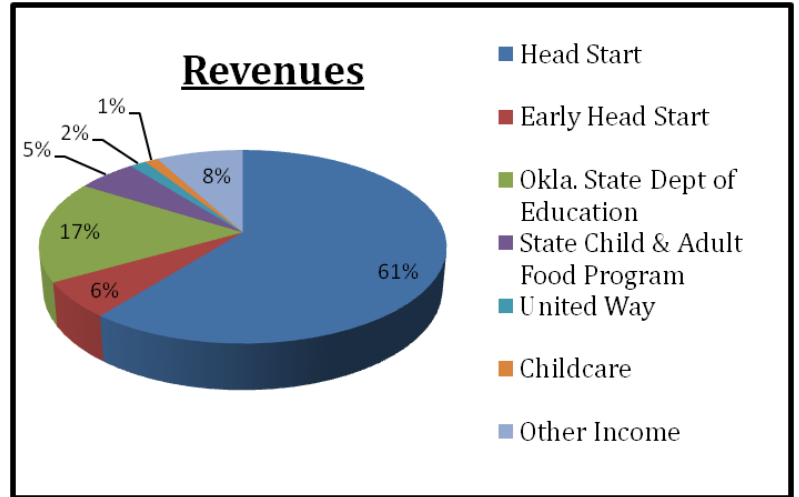

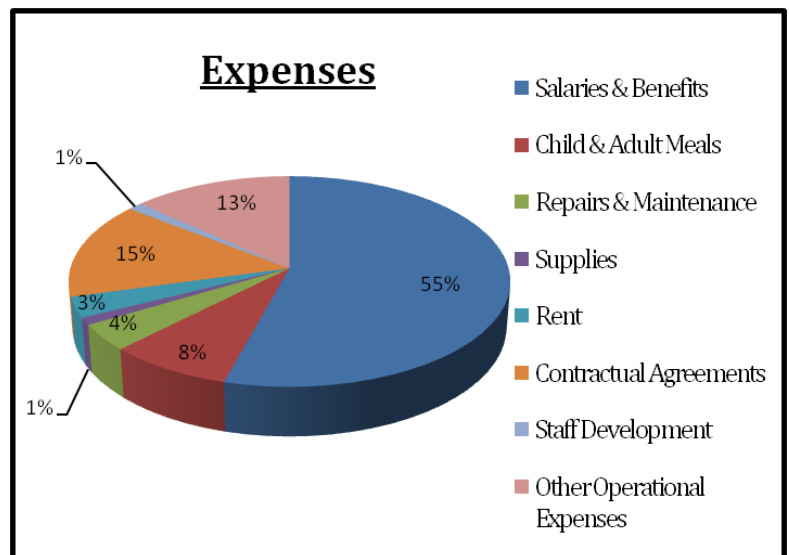

## **ENROLLMENT**

Community Action Project's Head Start and Early Head Start program enrollment is reflected in the following charts:

Through Head Start, Community Action Project serves 13.7% of the community's eligible children, based on the number of those under age five living in poverty reported in the 2009 Community Assessment.

## **PARENT INVOLVEMENT**

In order to engage parents in their children's learning and educational process, Community Action Project's Head Start program offers a variety of parent involvement activities. These activities include: access to individualized family support services; parent group meetings on such topics as reading to your child, positive parenting, and stress management; monthly parent connection socialization groups; male involvement sporting activities; take-home learning game educational activities, resource fairs and a

parent activity carnival; scrapbooking and sewing classes; nutrition and cooking workshops; and monthly Policy Council meetings. In addition, CAP also offers some specialized opportunities to parents of children enrolled in Head Start, including the *CareerAdvance* job training program which helps parents earn certifications to become employed in the health care field; a longitudinal alumni research project to gain more information about participants upon departure from the program; *Healthy Women Healthy Futures* which helps mothers learn about proper health and diet between pregnancies; and *Tuesday Tales*, a family literacy program. All of these parent involvement activities help connect Head Start parents with their children’s early education.

**PREPARING CHILDREN FOR SCHOOL**

School readiness is an essential component of Community Action Project’s Head Start program. In order to accomplish this goal, the program incorporates a range of techniques to help ensure that children leave Head Start prepared to enter kindergarten. Efforts to improve developmental readiness of enrolled children focus on the following areas:

- Cognitive (language and communication)
- Language development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Science
- Creative arts
- Social/emotional
- Physical/health

Teachers engage children in each of these areas by introducing a variety of learning opportunities into each classroom through daily interactions guided by the Creative Curriculum®. As a result, Community Action Project’s Head Start program gives students the tools they need to be better prepared for kindergarten and future academic success.
