CAP to Host Grand Opening For Skelly Early Childhood Education Center

Community Action Project of Tulsa County will host a grand opening celebration for its new Skelly Early Childhood Education Center, located at 8811 E. 31st St, at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, July 31.

Speakers will include Mayor Kathy Taylor, City Councilor Bill Martinson, TPS representatives including Superintendent Michael Zolkoski, and representatives from the Oklahoma State Department of Education and the George Kaiser Family Foundation, among others. Remarks begin at 1:30 p.m.; tours of the building and on-site enrollment services are available from 2:00-5:00 p.m.

The Center will provide 12 classrooms to serve approximately 150 children ages birth through four, and will open to enrolled children on August 11.

The Skelly Early Childhood Education Center is operated by Community Action Project in partnership with Family & Children's Services. It is supported by funding from the State of Oklahoma and private donors, including the George Kaiser Family Foundation, as part of the State of Oklahoma's Pilot Early Childhood Program, which seeks to enhance and expand high quality early childhood education throughout Oklahoma for children birth through three years of age.
